


Preserving Power Locally for Job Growth

Preservation Power is a New York State economic development program administered by the New York Power Authority (NYPA). It is meant to attract businesses and spur expansion of existing facilities in the North Country region. The program is comprised of 490 megawatts of competitively priced hydropower generated at NYPA's St. Lawrence-Franklin D. Roosevelt Power Project in Massena.

Preservation Power is only available to qualified businesses in Franklin, Jefferson and St. Lawrence counties.





Eligibility

- Business must demonstrate long-term commitment to the region through job creation and planned capital investment in the development of a new facility or expansion of an existing facility
- Project must be in the initial or conceptual planning phase
- Facility must be located in Franklin, Jefferson or St. Lawrence counties
- Minimum of 100 kilowatts of new electric load resulting from the construction of a new facility or expansion of an existing facility

- Facility to receive power must be served by National Grid or New York State Electric & Gas Corporation
- Project must start within one year of allocation award by NYPA
- Project must be complete, with corresponding job commitments fulfilled, within three years of delivery of power to the facility
- Not eligible are residential customers, retail businesses, places of overnight accommodations, tourist destinations, and not-for-profit businesses
