Mission Statement

(Reviewed and Reaffirmed in Public Session on March 30, 2023)

The mission of the St. Lawrence County Industrial Development Agency ("IDA") is to promote, encourage, attract, and develop job opportunities and economically sound commerce and industry in St. Lawrence County. To accomplish its mission, the IDA constructs and owns industrial sites and buildings, administers loan packaging and industrial revenue bond financing, and provides a variety of tax-reduction incentives.




Performance Goals

- Act as a liaison with businesses and government to help coordinate economic development services and reduce bureaucracy
- Work cooperatively with area economic development agencies to market County assets and economic development resources to potential new or expanding businesses
- Ensure a transparent and accountable operation with responsibly-managed Agency assets


2023 Performance Review (January 2023 – December 2023)

Job, PILOT Payment, and Investment Impact


Active IDA projects significantly contribute to job creation and retention in St. Lawrence County. In 2023, 45 active IDA projects supported the retention of 615 jobs and the creation of 225 new jobs, resulting in 840 jobs represented by the projects.




Active projects with IDA PILOTs represent an increase of nearly \$12 million in assessed property value in the County. By the end of the PILOTs, the increase will reach over \$50 million.



Approximately 30 active IDA PILOTs in 2023 resulted in significant investment in the tax base and payments to local communities, schools, and the County. A total of \$820,526.94 in PILOT payments related to IDA projects were made in 2023. Of this amount, \$40,903 went to local villages or the City of Ogdensburg, \$92,601.82 went to local towns, \$203,374.57 went to St. Lawrence County, and \$484,457.55 went to local school districts. These payments are provided to the taxing jurisdictions on the same pro rata basis as tax payments and are above and beyond the taxes paid on the underlying property for the projects.





Prior to the inception of the 30 IDA PILOTs, the underlying property for these projects generated \$78,777 in property taxes for the taxing jurisdictions (local, town, school, and county). The PILOT payments now represent more than a tenfold increase in revenue to the taxing jurisdictions.



The numbers and charts above represent the performance of <u>active IDA projects only</u>, the consolidated numbers for IDA, IDA-Local Development Corporation, and IDA-Civic Development Corporation numbers are much higher. Overlapping projects which include IDA and IDA-Local Development Corporation participation (for example, an IDA PILOT and an IDA-LOC loan) have been reconciled to avoid double-counting in the numbers and graphics below.

The combined totals of active IDA, LDC, and CDC projects represents over 2,600 jobs retained, over 280 created, and a combined project investment in St. Lawrence County of nearly \$490 million. This is for active projects only and does not include historical project activity where IDA assistance has been completed or for LDC loans and CDC bonds which have been repaid.





Projects, Activities, and Initiatives

Air Products

The IDA continues to work with Air Products and Chemicals, Inc. to develop the company's \$425 million green hydrogen production facility in Massena. A public hearing was held in October for IDA incentives for the project, including a Payment-in-Lieu-of-Tax Agreement ("PILOT") and a

Sales and Use Tax Exemption. Site clearing work on the 84-acre parcel for the project has started.


Air Products - an American-based global industrial gases company has been in operation for more than 80 years and serves a wide range of industries including healthcare, technology, and clean energy.

This project will create 90 jobs while supporting New York State's goal of becoming a Regional Clean Energy Hydrogen Hub.

The IDA worked closely with the New York Power Authority to attract Air Products to Massena. NYPA has



granted an allocation of 94 megawatts from its low-cost Preservation Power program for the project



Northeastern Sign

Northeastern Sign Corporation, a sign manufacturer and installer in South Colton, is undertaking an expansion of their facility. The project was approved for a Sales and Use Tax Exemption by the IDA for the purchase of equipment and building materials.





As part of the project, the St. Lawrence River Valley Redevelopment Agency provided \$110,000 in low-interest loan funds for the acquisition of equipment.

The company currently employs eight full-time equivalent employees and plans to add two full-time equivalent jobs as a result of the project.

Alcoa

The IDA secured \$900,000 in NYS Department of Transportation ("DOT") Passenger and Freight Rail Assistance Program funds to help Alcoa replace ties, timbers, switches, rail anchors and signals on the rail infrastructure at its smelter in Massena.



The Massena facility is the world's longest continuously operating aluminum smelter, having been in operation since 1902. By providing funding to assist with the upgrades to the rail service at the facility, the IDA and DOT are aiding Alcoa's ongoing efforts to ensure the safety, efficiency, and competitiveness of the plant, which currently employs over 450 individuals.

Agriculture

The IDA participated in the 2023 St. Lawrence County Agricultural Tour, which provides information on the issues and opportunities for farmers and the agriculture sector in St. Lawrence County. The IDA sponsors the tour to help show the wide spectrum of project activity with which the IDA is involved, including in the agriculture industry.

The Cornell Cooperative Extension of St. Lawrence County was provided a \$25,000 loan from the St. Lawrence County IDA - Civic Development Corporation to assist with the completion of upgrades to the Agricultural Studies Academy classroom and will leverage the ARPA funds also awarded for the project that the IDA is administering on behalf of St. Lawrence County.

In October, the IDA was presented with the Friend of the Extension Award at the Cornell Cooperative Extension annual dinner.

When the award was presented, Patrick Ames highlighted the IDA's involvement in agriculture and agri-business projects over the years, including work on biodigesters, milking parlors, and orchards as a few examples. Mr. Ames also pointed out the assistance provided by the IDA to the Extension with its projects and the strong working relationship between the organizations.





NYSERDA Build Ready Solar and Benson Mines

The IDA has been working with the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority ("NYSERDA") to assist in determining appropriate sites for NYSERDA's Build Ready Solar Program. The Build Ready program takes difficult sites and makes them "build-ready" for private renewable energy developers to ultimately construct and operate.

As part of this collaborative effort, the initial Build Ready solar site in the state will be the BR Benson Mines Solar Project in the Town of Clifton. A 111-acre parcel will be used for the project, and NYSERDA has secured the permitting and approvals necessary to build the project and is now undertaking a bid process to secure a private developer to undertake the project. The project is located in an area covered by tailing materials from the original mining operations at the site, and for which there are limited uses.

A public hearing was held in Cranberry Lake in December by the IDA with participation from NYSERDA. The project was then approved for a 20-year PILOT by the IDA. In addition to generating PILOT revenue and renewable energy development activity on this underutilized property, a \$200,000 Community Benefit Fund will be established by the project developer selected by NYSERDA. The IDA will administer this fund once it is created.





Bent Beam Brewing

St. Lawrence Suds dba Bent Beam Brewing has acquired the former McCarthy's Furniture Barn in the Village of Canton. The company will construct a microbrewery in the building to be operated under the planned name of "Bent Beam Brewery."

The Village of Canton received a Restore NY grant for the restaurant component of the project. IDA incentives and a \$50,000 loan by the IDA Local Development Corporation ("IDA-LDC")will assist in the equipping and rehabilitating of the building envelope and brewing section of the facility. While experiencing supply chain issues, changes were necessary regarding the Project Amount and Benefited Project Amount, so the Estimated Value of NYS Sales and Local Tax Exemption to be provided to the Company for the project, and the timing of the project, have been modified.

Benson Mines Rail

The SLCIDA authorized expenditures for professional services for the Benson Mines Rail Access Project for the Site Aggregate Loading Facility in the Town of Clifton.

The project received an award from the Department of Transportation 2016 Passenger and Freight Rail Assistance Program and has requested several extensions over the years.

St. Lawerence Centre

The St. Lawrence Centre Mall, now referred to as St. Lawrence Centre Industrial Complex, has repurposed over 200,000 sq ft of space for warehousing and industrial use and plans to increase this footprint in the future. The overall facility is over 600,000 sf and offers room for a variety of light to medium manufacturing and other industrial operations. The IDA is working with the owners to promote and recruit businesses into the available space.

100 Paterson Street

Ongoing work for the next phase of the 100 Paterson Street revitalization project in Ogdensburg was completed. A local contractor, Doyle Builders, was awarded the bid for the project which consisted of the replacement of the roof on the 1946 section of the building, tenant improvements, site work for base and paving of parking, outside staircases, concrete blocks, and electrical work.

The first tenant in the building, Canexsys Network Solutions, a vertically integrated electrical mechanical manufacturer primarily focusing on the broadband sector, is utilizing 8,000 square feet with an option to increase its space to up to 38,000 square feet. Additionally, Corning entered into a lease agreement to lease 20,000 square feet of warehouse space in the building. This is a two-year lease with extension options that will assist a local manufacturer with over 300 employees.

ATL

Atlantic Testing Laboratories, Limited was approved for a sales tax exemption by the IDA and a loan of up to \$322,000 by the St. Lawrence County IDA – Local Development Corporation and St. Lawrence River Valley Redevelopment Agency to acquire specialized Geoprobe drilling equipment. The equipment will support ATL's focus on expansion into environmental, geotechnical, and exploration activities.

The company has locations all around the state, with its headquarters and drilling division located in St. Lawrence County.

Previous drill rig projects the Agency has undertaken have met employment requirements. This project is expected to create two more full-time equivalent employees at the company's drilling division in Canton.

Solar PILOTs

Seven community-scale solar development projects were approved for PILOT assistance by the IDA in 2023. Three additional solar projects utilizing RPTL-487 PILOTs will be managed by the IDA. These projects will add nearly 51 MW of renewable energy production capacity in the County and will provide an additional \$236,399 in new PILOT revenue for the County and local taxing jurisdictions in the first year of the PILOT agreements, a figure that will increase by 2% per year over the life of the PILOTs. There are now 33 active community solar projects in the County representing approximately 143 MW of renewable energy. There are a few more projects in the development pipeline as well as a small number of larger, utility-scale projects which have been proposed.

Michels Power

Michels Power, Inc. moved out of the Canton Industrial Building and is now leasing approximately 6,600 square feet of space in the Massena Industrial Park Lot 19 building owned by the St. Lawrence River Valley Redevelopment Agency. The lease rate charged to Michels includes a PILOT figure that will be collected and passed to the jurisdictions for the time frame that the space is leased. The other tenant in the Massena building, Fockler Industries, is already on a full-payment PILOT for its space. The building, which was once fully vacant, will generate approximately \$18,000 in PILOT payments

APEX Accelerator



In partnership with the Development Authority of the North Country, the IDA assisted with marketing the services offered by the Empire APEX Accelerator, which provides assistance to local businesses to help them understand the process for procuring military and other federal, state, and local government

contract work that will enable them to grow their client base. A representative from Empire APEX Accelerator schedules office hours at the IDA to meet with local businesses in-person as necessary.

Massena School of Business

As part of the Massena Downtown Revitalization Initiative ("DRI"), the IDA received a \$1.9 million grant award from Empire State Development for the Massena School of Business Façade Restoration Project.

The IDA and the Village of Massena prepared a Memorandum of Agreement to identify the specific roles of each party involved in the project, the goal of which is to preserve the building's historic façade and improve access to the downtown Main Street business corridor. The IDA will provide bridge financing, project oversite and grant administration for the project. In September, the IDA authorized an agreement with the Development Authority of the North Country ("DANC") to provide planning and technical assistance services for the project.

New York State Correctional Facilities

The IDA continues to work with the County Ogdensburg Correctional Facility ("OCF") Re-Use Task Force to find a productive reuse for the facility. The closure in March 2022 resulted in the loss of 270 jobs and a \$25 million payroll.

In light of the continued threat of prison closures in New York State, the IDA approved a resolution in support of the continued operation of the remaining two New York State correctional facilities, Gouverneur Correctional Facility and Riverview Correctional Facility, in St. Lawrence County.

Building Connections to Local Resources

A Business Resource Mixer was held on March 8th at the Best Western University Inn in Canton. Approximately 65 business representatives along with local colleges, universities, and business resource partners were in attendance.

Three local businesses, Tradesman Contracting, Structural Wood Corporation, and Potsdam Specialty Papers formed a panel of speakers to discuss workforce attraction and retention of employees with IDA CEO Patrick Kelly acting as the moderator of the panel.

Positive feedback received after the event indicated attendees benefited from the exchange of information.

Business in the Spotlight events, hosted by the St. Lawrence County Chamber, were attended by IDA staff to help connect businesses with resources needed to ensure successful operations. Events were attended throughout St. Lawrence County, with one event at Applewood Orchards in Rensselaer Falls, where the IDA helped assist in the transition to a new ownership group through a financing package which included a loan from the North Country Economic Development Fund.

The IDA also sponsored a workshop at its own office in Canton with CITEC involving Workplace Problem Solving. Approximately a dozen attendees from local businesses attended, including some IDA staff.

As part of the St. Lawrence County Chamber of Commerce monthly Lunch and Learn Webinar Series, the IDA and the NYS Department of Labor presented on a topic involving job postings as a resource for employers recruiting workers and for applicants seeking local employment opportunities. An introduction on how to use the Jobs page on the IDA website demonstrated how employers can post their own job openings and on how applicants can view the openings.

Business Connection: Spotlight on Resources, a subcommittee of the St. Lawrence County Workforce Pipeline Committee, of which the IDA is a member, held events earlier in the year at each of the three BOCES Tech Centers in St. Lawrence County. These events enabled local employers to undertake group tours with students and instructors to help spotlight the programs and services offered at the Tech Centers.

Many employers who attended the Business Connections events expressed interest in connecting with BOCES students. Job Fairs were held at the three BOCES Career and Technical Centers the week of June 5th. IDA staff outreached several businesses to inform them of the opportunities available for hiring graduating seniors from the three BOCES tech centers and to demonstrate how businesses can connect with students for internship opportunities.

The Business Connections: Spotlight on Resources committee also coordinated a tour of the Canino School of Engineering at SUNY Canton. About 30 business representatives were in attendance to learn how to connect with programs and students at SUNY Canton.

This event was modeled after the successful BOCES tours which have proven valuable to local employers. The IDA is driving the effort to help connect local employers to these programs, so they are aware of the resources at hand and have access to potential employees.

Manufacturing Day was held on October 19, 2023. IDA staff served as tour guide assistants at various manufacturing facilities around St. Lawrence County to help introduce local high school students to real —world occupations in the manufacturing industry.

As part of an ongoing effort to connect the regional military population to local job opportunities, the IDA and St. Lawrence County Chamber have partnered at events on Fort Drum including job fairs, a North Country Expo, and other informational exchanges.



The goal of this effort is to help strengthen the connections between the region's employers and the Fort Drum related talent pool of military spouses and transitioning soldiers and help local employers in their quest for workforce talent.

Similar initiatives are underway with the local schools, BOCES, and colleges and universities.

Center for Entrepreneurial Leadership

The St. Lawrence County Center for Entrepreneurial Leadership ("STL-CEL"), a program collaboration with the University of Buffalo School of Management Center for Entrepreneurial Leadership, SUNY Canton, the IDA, and other member organizations of the St. Lawrence County Small Business Working Group saw 7 graduates complete the 2023 program in June of this year.

This is the 3rd class to complete the course and over 30 small business leaders in St. Lawrence County have now completed the program. Participants are pleased with the content of the program, with several former and recent participants recommending the course to other local business leaders.

The IDA-LDC's John Pinkerton will help facilitate the 2024 class held weekly at the IDA main conference room from January through June.

Workforce Development Institute

The IDA continues to work in partnership with the Workforce Development Institute ("WDI") to address workforce challenges and opportunities. In 2023, five projects or sponsorships impacting St. Lawrence County employers received assistance from the WDI.

A partnership with Arconic allowed several of their employees to receive technical programmatic training. Structural Wood Corporation also partnered with WDI to provide management training for some of their employees. The WDI assisted both the Adirondack North Country Alliance and the North Country Alliance ("NCA") with sponsorships of the NCA Annual Meeting, the Small Communities, Big Opportunities Conference, and Buyer Days.

While these events were not held in St. Lawrence County, they served St. Lawrence County residents and business owners. A partnership with the United Way of Northern NY, which serves Jefferson, St. Lawrence, and Lewis Counties, also allowed for the development of a Workplace Stability Program for employers throughout the tri-county region. These partnerships with the Workforce Development Institute were estimated to directly impact 45 individuals by increasing their knowledge and skills base, as well as benefiting the attendees at sponsored events.

Power Proceeds Fund

The Northern New York Power Proceeds Allocation Board ("NNYPPAB") makes funding recommendations to the New York Power Authority ("NYPA") for projects that demonstrate economic development benefits in St. Lawrence County. The Northern New York Power Proceeds Act, passed in December 2014, allows for NYPA to deposit the net earnings from the market sale of ten megawatts of unallocated power from the St. Lawrence-FDR Power Project into the fund.

The NNYPPAB is comprised of the following members appointed by the Governor: Chairman Patrick Kelly, CEO of the St. Lawrence County IDA; Robert McNeil, McNeil Accounting Services, Lisbon; and, Theresa Phalon, Past President and CEO of North Country Savings Bank, Canton. There are currently two vacancies on the board awaiting gubernatorial appointment.

As of January 2024, the total amount of Power Proceeds fund deposited is \$8,974,378 with awards of \$2,270,017 — making \$6,704,361 available for qualifying projects. Supporting 160 jobs and \$30.6 million of investments, projects which have received awards include:

Governance and Compliance

At the IDA's Annual Meeting, the following officers were elected to a one-year term: Brian W. Staples (Chair); Lynn Blevins (Vice-Chair); and Ernest J. LaBaff (Secretary)

Brian Staples and Ernie LaBaff were reappointed by the County Board of Legislators to serve another three-year term on the IDA.

Board members approved the 2022 Independent Audit reports in March of 2023. The reports showed no findings. Legislators have been provided the reports electronically. In addition, the reports are available on our website at www.SLCIDA.com.

As part of our Public Authority Law compliance program, annual policy reviews are conducted by the IDA and its affiliated organizations. In the first quarter the Property Disposition, Whistleblower, Code of Ethics, Defense & Indemnification, and Compensation, Reimbursement & Attendance policies were reviewed. Performance documents for 2022 were also reviewed. Staff members participated in interactive harassment prevention training, in conjunction with a revised policy and training materials.

IDA CEO Patrick Kelly served as Immediate Past Chair of the New York State Economic Development Council ("NYSEDC"). The NYSEDC is the state's principal organization representing economic development professionals. The organization's 900 members includes Industrial Development Agencies, Local Development Corporations, commercial and investment banks, underwriters, law firms, utilities, chambers of commerce, higher education institutions, and private corporations.

The purpose of NYSEDC is to promote the economic development of the state and its communities, to encourage sound practices in the conduct of regional and statewide development programs, and to develop education programs that enhance the professional development skills of its members.

The SLCIDA also remains active with a number of local and regional organizations, including the North Country Alliance, Drum Country Business, the St. Lawrence County Chamber of Commerce, the North Country Chamber of Commerce, the St. Lawrence County Economic Development Study Advisory Board, the St. Lawrence County Business Connections: Spotlight on Resources committee, and numerous other committees and working groups focused on community, economic, and workforce development in the county and region.

Marketing and Promotion

The IDA also continued aggressive marketing efforts to better inform local businesses of our resources, to attract outside businesses and investment to St. Lawrence County, and to seek out alumni and former residents of the area to return to the County. Some of these efforts include:

- Streaming TV advertisements in Canada using the video created for the IDA website.
 While reviewing analytical data, response to the commercial appeared strong with a higher percentage than expected of people viewing the commercial in its entirety.
- O Distributing informational flyers with the "Come Back Home and Bring Your Business" theme at local alumni events, reunions, and festivals this summer to foster attraction efforts, such as the Bass Masters Open in Massena. On-air ads during the Clarkson and St. Lawrence University hockey games also promote this theme as well.
- Staff attendance at the Canadian Manufacturing and Technology Show in Toronto, the EpTech show in Montreal, Advanced Design and Manufacturing Expo in Toronto, the Select USA-Canada event in Montreal.

Staff also attended the North Country Alliance Fall Symposium and after the event, provided a tour of the county to the NYSERDA representatives.

O Additionally, staff hosted Empire State Development agri-business sector representatives to show the potential for agri-business development in St. Lawrence County as part of a Drum Country regional tour.

- The creation and utilization of advertising and media promotion pieces, including placements in North Country This Week and Northern New York Newspapers.
- Maintaining memberships in Canadian trade organizations to facilitate access to events and to maintain key contacts with Canadian companies and multiplier organizations.
- O Collaborating with NYPA to enhance the value of the IDA's website and social media presence. We continue to promote business resources in St. Lawrence County and to position the County as a location for new investment and a destination from outside the area. Since the start of the new year, there has been an increase in utilization of our website and social media platforms. Postings offer information pieces as well as general updates and promotional messaging.

- Outreach to numerous businesses in the following industry sectors:
 - Food production
 - Glass manufacturing
 - Plastics and plastic manufacturing, molding, extrusion
 - Fiber, yarn, filament, thread manufacturing
 - Paper/packaging industries
 - Music industry
 - Businesses whose operations would benefit from the graduates, faculty, and facilities at the local universities.



Drum Country Website

The IDA continued a commitment of funds for the Drum Country Business Regional Marketing Initiative This effort represents a collaboration of the St. Lawrence, Jefferson, and Lewis County IDAs, the Development Authority of the North Country, and National Grid partnering with Fort Drum to promote and develop the region. The goal is to promote St. Lawrence County to audiences that might not recognize the County but do know the region.

Representatives from Fort Drum attended our Business Mixer event in March and discussed the process of transitioning soldiers into the regional workforce. This relationship with Fort Drum was developed as part of this initiative.

- o The addition of a Business Spotlight video featuring Potsdam Specialty Papers to our existing set of spotlight videos which include Atlantic Testing, Curran Renewable Energy, Five Mile Farm, Russell's Groom and Board, and a feature video on the IDA.
- o Notable highlights to the website and related social media platforms include:
 - Developed a platform for spotlighting successful businesses in SLC, fostering a sense of local pride and economic growth.
 - Further developments to the Jobs in SLC page to include a multitude of resources, job postings, and a form for job posting submission.
 - Continuation of the "Come Home to St Lawrence County" campaign to encourage alumni and previous residents to come back to the county.
 - Further developments to social content highlighting prominent community events that benefit workforce development.
 - Weekly posts have included information about key sectors in the local economy.

- Website and social media analytics include:
 - On average, there are about 13,000 people visiting the site per month, with an engagement rate of 51.69%.
 - Highest number of users per month in this period was in January and March, with another spike in early November, which demonstrates that our social media efforts are working.
 - Users spent an average of 4 minutes on the site showing users are continuing to spend more time during their sessions than last year.

Social Media Analytics Key Takeaways in 2023:

Over the course of the year, we saw performance levels grow significantly with Facebook, Instagram, and LinkedIn:

- Incorporated more quality-of-life posts/posts about community members. Stories about people interest people.
- There was a significant increase in page reach by 302%, and page and profile visits increased 90.5% compared to 2022. This means more viewers are seeking the information that the page provides. We posted a minimum of 2 times per week on the SLC IDA Facebook page throughout the year
- Twitter impressions reached roughly 6,000 for the year, with July being our best performing month with over a thousand impressions in a month. The Engagement Rate on Twitter increased in 2023 and performed better than 2022.
- On Instagram, we saw page reach increase dramatically by 3.0k%. This has to do with the Family Child Care Training Program ad that ran. Regardless of that ad, reach still would have increased.



American Rescue Plan Act Funding

In declaring that "economic development and tourism are essential to improving the services and activities available in St. Lawrence County," the St. Lawrence County Board of Legislators allocated \$3,400,000 in ARPA funds to be distributed through the IDA to organizations impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic through a number of program categories. In 2022, the total amount of ARPA funds awarded was \$734,581.00.



In 2023, the total amount of ARPA funds awarded was \$1,408,801.

ARPA: CDL-A

In 2023 there were five classes offered with a total of 26 people enrolled (6 of those for CDL-B certification and 20 for CDL-A certification). Only 3 individuals did not pass the road test and one of them is still working on it. Graduates have either obtained employment or have been promoted to CDL positions at the following businesses: Brookfield Power, Collins Construction, Liberty Utilities, MJT Trash Removal, NYS DOT, Pepsi Ogdensburg Bottlers, Peaceful Living Home Sales, Potsdam Central School Bus Garage, Poulin Grain, Stauffer Farm, LLC, SUNY Canton, Town of Russell, Upstone Materials, Wayne's Gas Station, and White & Patterson Grain.

SUNY Canton's CREST Center requested assistance in locating a trailer to replace the deteriorating one currently in use for the CDL-A Training Program. The IDA began outreaching businesses and Seaway Timber Harvesting donated a trailer for the program.

Additionally, the IDA partnered with the Cornell Cooperative Extension by pledging \$35,000 in these ARPA funds to support a Rural Business Development grant the CCE secured from the USDA for CDL-A training. Through this effort, the CCE and IDA are working together to leverage ARPA CDL-A to support driver training for St. Lawrence County farms. The training cost for farm enterprise drivers is being split 50/50 between the CCE USDA funds and County ARPA funds, resulting in no cost to the farms or the trainees.

ARPA: Heavy Equipment Operator and Certified Medical Assistant Training

St. Lawrence-Lewis BOCES Adult Education and Workforce Development received a Reimagine Workforce Grant for over \$250,000 to help leverage training funds for the Heavy Equipment Operator ("HEO") and Certified Clinical Medical Assistant Programs ("CCMA").

The Reimagine Grant was based on the program models that were created for the ARPA funding. As American Rescue Plan Act ("ARPA") funds are depleting, this will serve as an additional

funding stream to help sustain these program offerings. Of the 13 students participating in the CCMA classes in 2023, 2 received ARPA funding, and of the 18 students enrolled in the HEO training classes, 9 received ARPA funding.

Promotional activity promoting the Heavy Equipment Operator, Certified Clinical Medical Assistant, CDL-A, and Family Childcare training programs proved successful as many of these programs were full for each cohort in 2023.

ARPA: Childcare Training and Development

The St. Lawrence County Childcare Training Program will create greater access to quality childcare to allow individuals to enter (or re-enter) the workforce, encourage new business development, and support working families across St. Lawrence County.

The program, created with significant assistance from County ARPA funding, includes entrepreneurship training provided by the Small Business Development Center and enrollment in a 3-credit Early Childhood online course offered through SUNY Canton.


- Recognition of successful completion by 1st Cohort, startup grants awarded, participant feedback gathered.
- o Based on the insights of the SLC Child Care Council that providers are less likely to pursue an in-home Family or Family Group Day Care as summer approaches, efforts were focused on securing a testimonial and program promotion after the start of the school year.
- As a result of having to recover expenses paid for two participants of ECHD 101 who did not complete the other program requirements, FCCTP was modified to require licensure first, then successful completion of SBDC training, prior to enrollment in ECHD 101, with reinforced messaging, transition support between each step, and inclusion of claw back language in the program enrollment form.

- Launch of paid promotional plan to include placements on social media and local newspapers
 all to continue through the end of January 2024.
